



uScore Soccer Camp Guidelines and Procedures

When a child comes to a camp at uScore Soccer, they are in for lots of fun and lots of learning; more importantly, they will be safe.

Your child's safety is the most important detail that our staff and coaches encounter each day. We have Behavior Guidelines that all players, coaches, directors, and parents must follow to maintain a safe and healthy environment.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP SAFETY

- On the first day of check-in, parents will be given a pick-up card with the player's name on the card. This is needed to exit the building with your camper at pick-up time. If the pick-up card is not presented, then we will ask to see an ID.
- If another individual is picking up your child, please notify the uScore staff by email: info@uscoreindoor.com.
- If that individual does not have a pick up card, we will check their ID.

All parents/guardians must come into the building on Monday for drop off to get their Pick-Up Card.

BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES

For Coaches

- Dress and Speak appropriately, and in accordance with the standards set forth by Camp Directors.
- Every child should expect to be coached, not criticized, or made fun of.
- Coaches may high-five children but should not pick up a child or engage in any inappropriate touching.
- Coaches will never be alone with one child.
- Coaches/Adults are not allowed in the restrooms during a camper restroom break.

For Campers

- Speak appropriately to others. Profanity, vulgarity, or verbal bullying will not be tolerated.
- Report any mistreatment by other campers to the coaches.
- Listen carefully to instructions and do your best to follow them.
- Obey the facility rules that are discussed on the first day.
- Clean up after yourself.
- Do not leave the building without your parent or designated carpool driver.

For Parents

- Follow the Drop Off and Pick Up Procedures
- If a parent stays to watch the camp, they must do so from the upstairs viewing area.
- When watching your child, please cheer for good soccer and avoid "coaching" from the stands.

BEHAVIOR CORRECTION

When a camper does not follow the behavior guidelines, we will take the following steps:

1. Staff will redirect the camper to more appropriate behavior and will be reminded of the rules.
2. If the behavior persists, the child may be asked to sit out from an activity.
3. If the child continues to be a distraction to the coaches and other campers, a parent will be notified via phone and may the parent may be asked to come early to pick up the child.

Parents will be notified immediately if any instance threatens the immediate safety of their child or another child. uScore Soccer has the right to remove campers from the program in extreme situations.
